Race Analysis

1st 9 LIEUTENANT GENERAL is certainly bred to appreciate sprinting on the turf as he is a half-brother to multiple Grade 1-winning turf sprinter Golden Pal out of Grade 3 turf-sprint winner Lady Shipman. Figures to show good positional speed after facing Discreet Mischief, who then placed in a first-level allowance on dirt at Churchill with an 88 Beyer.

Pimlico

- 2nd 2 PORQUEROLLES has tons of upside potential and ran well to just miss against favored What Say Thee in first start against winners. Looked good breezing a solo five-eighths at Fair Hill on 5/10 and can be the strongest late in the lane..
- 3rd 1 MIRAHMADI might be the horse to beat returning from 251-day layoff with new Lasix. Showed good early foot in the Del Mar Futurity over speed-friendly track, then stayed gamely for second behind highly regarded stablemate Prince of Monaco
- 4th 3 DISCO EBO had a pretty easy time of it when besting only three others in Laurel's Primonetta. Set the pace while slightly off the rail, controlled easy fractions, then sprinted home under a drive. The pace is likely to be quicker this afternoon, but think this mare is still the speed of the speed, and she should be squarely in the thick of things when they turn for home. 4 APPLE PICKER bested the top pick going seven-eighths in the Grade 3 Fritchie when receiving hot splits to attack, then faced a pretty solid group in last month's Grade 3 Distaff at Aqueduct (the winner then ran third in the Grade 2 Ruffian there with an 89 Beyer). She's plenty capable at this six-furlong distance, and only need a bit of pace to adequately setup her late bid
- 5th ² MARIAN CROSS cuts back precipitously in distance after racing two turns over synthetic at Gulfstream. Tracked along the rail, came through an open inside corridor at the quarter pole, came off the inside in upper stretch, then failed to stay the trip. Expect more patient tactics at this sharper distance
- 6th ² CATS BY FIVE stalked in between horses in Oaklawn's Bachelor, eased three wide into the stretch, then stayed on decently for a minor award in a race that was controlled by the front-runners. There's a good chance this pace gets quick, and he could benefit from a hot duel up front. 6 FROST FREE finished ahead of the top pick in his last two starts, and he is very fast from the gate. Opened up the lead in the blink of an eye in the Bachelor, then held second behind the quality favorite. Very dangerous if allowed a breather in the opening quarter mile.
- 7th 7 FLUFFY SOCKS was really up against it in the Grade 1 Jenny Wiley when attempting to rally into glacial fractions set by the 25-1 winner in a race where they ran 1-2-3 all the way around. The eighth-finisher then ran second in the Grade 3 Sheepshead Bay in New York with a 90 Beyer. Veteran isn't exactly a win machine and might have to deal with a slow pace once again, but she fits this class level like a glove, and handles all types of footing
- 8th 3 SUPER CHOW has good early speed and is expected to be on or near the lead following a successful winter-spring in New York. Took a couple of Grade 3's over wet tracks, then might have been in just a bit tough when a no-excuse third in the Grade 2 Carter after setting reasonable fractions. The winner of that race then placed in the Grade 3 Westchester with a 94 Beyer.

9th 12 FULMINEO was wired by 5-year-old Sports Editor in circuit debut, and might get a quicker pace to attack this time around. Saved ground in midpack last time, angled out into the stretch and finished willingly. Looked comfortable breezing in new blinkers at Fair Hill on 5/10.

10TH 10 IMPERIAL GUN pulled hard along the rail to prompt the pace, settled into the pocket, split horses on the second turn, eased out for full clearance, then tried hard to just miss in Oaklawn's Bathhouse Row. This isn't the most ideal post, but he has enough tactical speed to find position without losing too much ground on the first turn.. Although 8 TUSCAN SKY only beat two others over Fair Grounds slop two back, he ran down a useful loose leader in odds-on Nash. Fell behind in the early stages of the Wood Memorial, then seemed a bit uncomfortable when trying to rally in between rivals on the second turn. The third-finisher then ran third in the Grade 2 Peter Pan with an 89 Beyer. He's another getting blinkers for the first time, and that might sharpen his early speed..

11TH 11 WITTY makes second start back, loves this distance and also turf with some moisture. 12 BEER CAN MAN has the class edge with starts in graded stakes in last 4.

12TH 10 EMMANUEL looks like the horse to beat dropping out of a strong edition of the Grade 1 Maker's Mark (runner-up then placed in Churchill's Grade 1 Turf Classic with a 102 Beyer) over yielding ground. Wound up on the lead by default before tiring and think he's better with a target or two at this point in his career. Should get that kind of setup from just off the lead and figures right there when they swing into the straight.3 BALNIKHOV is a one-run closer dependent on race and pace luck, but he kicks hard given the right flow. Saved ground at the back in the San Francisco Mile, slipped through on the fence, then finished evenly after hopping back to his left lead. BEATBOX raced outside in midpack in the Muniz at Fair Grounds, made an outside bid, then finished evenly behind an impressive winner. The third-finisher then ran third in the Turf Classic with a 98 Beyer. Consistent and tactical, he seems to be improving with each start.

13TH -THE PREAKNESS -

3 CATCHING FREEDOM ran well for fourth in the Derby, but overall had a good trip. Raced in between behind that fast pace, followed 5 MYSTIK DAN into the stretch, then finished with interest while over in behind rivals. He's beaten Mystik Dan in the past, however, and might show a bit more tactical speed in this shorter field. Expecting him to kick on late for barn that went 6 for the last 20 (30%, \$2.01 ROI) with horses returning in two weeks or less. Although MYSTIK DAN did receive a perfect trip and ride when capturing the Derby, he doesn't get enough credit for staying close to those fast fractions and still finishing with determination. Tracked from the pocket, bulled his way through at the quarter pole while hopping to his right lead, then dug down to fend off the closers. He has the tactical speed that leads to good trips and is an obvious danger. Barn went 3 for the last 13 (23%, \$2.12 ROI) with last-out winners returning on dirt. Trainer Chad Brown's two Preakness winners were both fourth-time starters that lost their final prep and skipped the Kentucky Derby to concentrate on this race. 9. IMAGINATION looks like the speed of the race for Bob Baffert and Frankie Dettori. Finished ahead of two next-out winners when necked in the Santa Anita Derby, and the fifth-finisher flattered that performance by then winning the Lazaro Barrera Stakes by seven lengths with a 101 Beyer. Very dangerous if allowed to shake loose on soft fractions.

I have a slew of reasons for making Imagination my top pick in the Preakness.

: I not only believe that Imagination has a good chance to win, he will be a much better price than Mystik Dan.Do I like Imagination even more with Muth out? Yes, I do.

Imagination's trainer has won the Preakness a record eight times. Baffert's winners have been Silver Charm in 1997, Real Quiet in 1998, Point Given in 2001, War Emblem in 2002, Lookin At Lucky in 2010, American Pharoah in 2015, Justify in 2018 and National Treasure in 2023.

While Mystik Dan did win the Kentucky Derby, was he the best horse in the race? I'm not so sure.Look, I think Mystik Dan deserves a lot of credit for his Derby victory. He won it fair and square. But I also think Mystik Dan benefited from a ride by Brian Hernandez Jr. that was nothing less than a rail-hugging masterpiece. And Mystik Dan deserves credit for being brave enough to unhesitatingly charge through a small hole turning for home, a hole that was so tight that Hernandez's left boot actually smacked the rail.Nevertheless, all in all, I came away from this year's Kentucky Derby with the opinion that Mystik Dan quite possibly was no better than the third-best horse in the race. And Thoro-Graph does support this view of mine.

Imagination goes into the Preakness having been a model of consistency so far. He hasn't finished worse than second in six career starts. When I spoke with Baffert after Imagination won Santa Anita's San Felipe Stakes by a head on March 3 despite getting bumped hard going into the clubhouse turn, it reminded me a lot of what Baffert had once told me about National Treasure when he was a 2-year-old in 2022. Baffert said that while he considered National Treasure to be a good 2-year-old, "I think he will be even better on down the line."

Well, it turned out that Baffert was right, as he usually is when it comes to his thoughts regarding a racehorse. On down the line as a 3-year-old, National Treasure won the Preakness. Later in 2023, he narrowly lost the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile to the older Cody's Wish, who would be voted Horse of the Year. Earlier this year, National Treasure won the Pegasus World Cup.

Following this year's San Felipe, Baffert told me that he thought Imagination was improving and that his best races might still be ahead for him.

After the San Felipe, Imagination was bet down to even-money favoritism in the Santa Anita Derby. I picked him to win. I expected him to win. Imagination did give a good account of himself, but he lost by a neck when having to settle for second to Stronghold.

At first I was down on Imagination for getting beat in the Santa Anita Derby. But after Stronghold subsequently didn't disgrace himself by finishing seventh of 20 in the Kentucky Derby, I now think that perhaps I judged Imagination a bit too harshly for not winning the Santa Anita Derby.

BloodHorse's Bob Ehalt wrote this week that Imagination, a \$1.05 million yearling purchase, is owned by SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Stonestreet Stables, Dianne Bashor, Robert Masterson, Waves Edge Capital, Catherine Donovan and Tom Ryan. It's "the same core group" of owners for National Treasure, Ehalt noted.

"This has been a target for us," Ryan said of the Preakness to Ehalt. "When he ran in the Santa Anita Derby, we felt we learned a lot about him, just like we did last year when National Treasure was fourth in that race. We knew he ran well and since then the horse has really developed physically, mentally and athletically. He's gotten fitter and tighter. He's been immature at times, but he continues to impress."

Imagination's team drill with Muth at Santa Anita last Friday (May 10) might be an indication that Imagination is indeed improving and that he's poised to run a biggie in the Preakness. Muth and Imagination were both timed in a bullet 1:11.80 for six furlongs. Imagination appeared to be no more than only a head in front, at the most, when they crossed the finish line. But a comment Baffert made to Daily Racing Form's David Grening with regard to that workout by Imagination caught my eye.

"Today was probably his best work since I've had him," Baffert said.

Imagination's Beyer Speed Figures are an indication to me that he is capable of winning the Preakness, especially if Baffert is right and we have not seen his best yet.

Imagination's Beyer Speed Figures were on an upward trajectory of 70, 78, 78, 92 and 96 until he posted an 89 in the Santa Anita Derby. But that 96 Beyer gives him a license to have a big say in the Preakness.It's not as if Imagination's 96 Beyer is a far cry from Mystik Dan's two best figures, which are 101 and 100.

Imagination's tactical speed could be a major asset this Saturday in a race that isn't expected to have a fast pace. Breaking from the outside post, Imagination can race on or just off the early lead without it taking a toll on him.

In terms of his breeding, the distance of the Preakness might be a good fit for Imagination.

Imagination is a Kentucky-bred son of super sire Into Mischief and the Empire Maker mare Magical Feeling. Into Mischief has yet to sire a Preakness winner, but he has had two winners of the Kentucky Derby in Authentic (2020) and Mandaloun (2021 through the disqualification of Medina Spirit). Laurel River, this year's sensational 8 1/2-length winner of the \$12 million Dubai World Cup, also is by Into Mischief.

A noteworthy stamina influence in Imagination's pedigree is Empire Maker, who managed to win the 1 1/2-mile Belmont Stakes.

First Race 5-6-2 5 TEPEU ran poorly when in cheap for her first start of 2024, then got somewhat back on track in two synthetic starts before leaving Florida; showed speed while entered in a much tougher spot in the NY debut off the layoff; dropping for a very good barn, and has the back races to be tough in here. 6 SKI COUNTRY missed a lot of time after being claimed for \$50k last summer at Monmouth; was protected by the waiver off the layoff when running evenly in a fast-paced race, then got wired over a wet track here last week; back quickly dropping again.

- Race 2 5-4-1 5 TEN TEN was making her debut in that most recent JINGLE JANGLE start; got right up close to the pace and worked hard in that spot while taking on a tough distance, and she stayed gamely to the end before settling for second; might not have to improve at all against this group.. 4 JINGLE JANGLE debuted in an off-turf sprint at Saratoga as a 2yo and looked like she might have needed that race after taking some money; didn't turn up again for over two months, where she went long on turf and faded behind a 100/1 winner; dropped for the 3yo debut, where she stumbled badly at the start; finally puts races together
- Race 3 4-6-1 4 PASCHAL MOON had little chance vs. the streaking Colonel Vargo over a speed-favoring track two starts back; landed in a fast-paced race vs. tougher last time; gets needed class relief for this.
- Race 4 4-2-6 4 SCHLOMO did a lot of racing after a bump at the start in his debut when asked to get a tough distance; forced a fast pace and was only second-best to a 3yo with some potential last time while earning a figure that stands out in this field.
- Race 5 3 -2-4 CITY MISCHIEF was going to win that turf sprint at Saratoga last July but bobbled a couple of different times while coming with late momentum and wound up falling short; has run some faster races since then in some tougher spots; can handle this distance but needs some pace. (off turf 4-5-3)
- Race 6 4-7-1-5 4 PRINCIPE D'ORO disappointed over a couple of wet tracks in his first two starts back from a long layoff and wound up getting dropped sharply in class last month; was quickly snapped up after dominating that weaker bunch and moves right back up in class off the claim for a trainer who is 8 for his last 28 with dirt routers first off the claim (29%, \$2.81 ROI).
- Race 7 7-2-5 7MAJESTIC FRONTIER nearly overcame a stumbling start followed by a couple of bumps when just missing with a career-best 84 Beyer back in February, then came right back to win his next start going longer; was on a difficult cutback in distance two starts back when getting untracked too late, and he got in too tough when up in class last time; drops back down and might be in better form than it appears.

Race 8 7-2-9 7 OPERATION TORCH flashed potential when finishing well in his debut last March, then powered away from maidens to win his second start after a good trip; wound up in some tough allowance races after that vs. the lines of Kalik (subsequent Grade 2 winner), and Program Trading (now a multiple Grade 1 winner); switches to Pletcher to begin his 4yo campaign. 2 RUSE has switched up his running style recently, and has been compromised a couple of times while being left with too much to do late; capable of taking advantage of this rail draw after breaking from the far outside and getting wired last time. 9 ALEXIS ZORBA has mostly concentrated on sprinting since arriving stateside, and he has been a disappointment overall, though he did win when stretched out to a mile in January; has speed stretching out again after just getting nailed in a sprint last time. Off Turf 14-1-4-11

Race 9 4-1-3-6 BEST BET:4 ASSET PURCHASE was impressive winning her career debut with a sharp run from just off the pace, then appeared to struggle with the mile distance in the Busher when squandering a clear stretch lead over a wet track; ran better than it looks off the layoff last time when forced to chase a fast pace after failing to break sharply from the gate, before collaring the in-form leader and then holding off the closers. 1HOT FUDGE bobbled awkwardly at the start and wound up in a pace duel when losing her winning streak in the Grade 3 Distaff last month; doesn't need the lead to be effective but a sharp break from the rail is imperative as she looks to rebound.

Race 10 7-5-6-3 . 7 GRAM endured a very tough trip and was unlucky when finishing second in her turf debut at Saratoga; came right back to win her next start, then ran in two open stakes before the layoff; returns in her available condition, and also adds Lasix for her 3yo debut. 5 DUSK had her first two starts rained off the turf but gained valuable experience in those races; stumbled at the start before racing greenly in the debut, then showed improved speed in the second start; finally got to the surface she is bred for at the end of October and dominated that field on the lead; forward to go and Lasix on 6 FANCYPANTS JULIANA earned a 74 Beyer in her debut as a 2yo, then got an unlucky trip in her second start before missing time, and she hasn't been on turf since; interesting getting back on grass as she returns from a layoff. (Off turf 7-3-13-5)

Race 11 9-8-5-7

9 OPERA DE RAVEL is a new face for top connections landing in a field where the experienced runners have left something to be desired so far; sire was an Irish 2000 Guineas winner; dam was Group 2-placed in Ireland, and placed in three graded stakes over here while also winning twice. 8 OUR FINEST HOUR has run at three different tracks already while steadily improving; was passing horses in a modestly-paced race last time; switches to Maker after selling for \$57k last month.

The 70 Beyer Speed Figure she generated in her last is far above the typical number for Illinois maidens. By that alone, she would figure to win this race by daylight. But, no guarantee. 7-IRISH SPARK generated a respectable number in her lone race but she was facing a far tougher field at Oaklawn. She's adding blinker for this. Her barn wins with 30% of runners making their second starts. I thought 1-LION LAW would be a logical favorite in her next start after her sharp 2024 debut but she could have a tough time beating the top pair. However, she does have the pedigree, she has speed and the rail. Might surprise. 4-JOYZELLA runs her heart out and is often in the money but think this field came up a bit too tough. 6-COME ON LADY didn't show a thing in her debut last year but she has had some outstanding drills coming into her 2024 debut and she gets the services of the leading rider.

He's had 17 races on the surface and managed one win but finished second eight times. However, the pace should set up well. Beware the late runner.



Could outlast them all either way though his barn, the leading barn, sports a paltry 4% win rate with runners stretching out. 14-COACH JIMMY D is entered for main track only. He's been facing maidens at the tough Oaklawn meet. He finished a distant third in his only two-turn race but think he's capable of far better. 12-EVEN THE WIND last raced in August but he's had quite a few good, long works getting him ready for his 2024 debut. He raced competitively in most previous turf races and his barn wins with about 36% of runners coming back from similar layoffs. He will be attacking late. 6-INTERLUDE showed little in his last start in New Orleans last year but he did finish second in the first two races of his career, all on turf. He's nowhere near as quick as some of the speedballs in this race but he'll never be too far off the pace. If all the speed gets tied up vying for the lead, he might be able to slip past late.

Late Pick 4 Ticket: 3,5,6,7 / 1,2,4 / 3,4,6,7,9 / 2,6 (\$60)

#3 Miss Mikos (9-5) might kick off this Pick 4 in style. The daughter of Enticed trained by Robertson ran VERY well chasing hot pace for open maiden \$30k claimers last time at The Fairgrounds, receiving a very solid 70 Beyer for the level. There are others that are lightly-raced and could improve as well, but if "Mikos" runs back to her last effort, she could be very tough. I'll spread to start the Late P4 for the simple fact that there are more questions than answers in this field, and horses can greatly improve in their 2nd career start.

Race 6: 1 - 2 - 4

A horse that's 2-for-28 (with 10 2nd's) and a closer going 5f are not exactly my cup of tea. That being said, #1 **Simple Logic (7-2)** is just that....a horse that is very consistent on the grass, has pace to run into, will save ground, and has numbers that fit vs. others. The gelding is clearly NOT a win machine, but I'm hoping Felix and Block have the right stuff to get the job done. He'll need to find room in the stretch at the most crucial times.

Race 7: 4 - 6 - 7

#4 Alvin (7-2) did not get off to the best of starts last time and was bumped, compromising his chances from the get-go. His previous races out of town would most likely be good enough today...maybe he needed a race over the track and time to get acclimated to Chicago. Not much to beat if he runs his "A to B" effort.

Race 8: 6 - 2 - 11

Final race of the day is a doozy...tough handicapping race and a great chance to make some money with a big field of maidens on the turf. I'll land on a price for Trainer Roussel and #6 Interlude (8-1). He raced well as a 2yo with two seconds in three starts. Centeno rides and already has a win for Roussell at the meet. The colt is training forwardly and steadily, and the son of Mendelsohn figures to take a forward move in his 3yo debut...he'll need to as his speed figs are slightly lower than a few in here.

First Race

A promising debut by 1 MISS ROCKETTE stamps the filly a likely winner second out. Her debut was a promising runner-up finish in a route; she was seven lengths clear of third. 'ROCKETTE pressed the pace in that Oaklawn Park race, shook off her rivals, then got collared by a deep closer in a solid effort. Muth's trainer Bob Baffert and jockey Juan Hernandez can team for a Preakness-day victory, after all. 5 MS BO J , in the money all four dirt starts, stretches out for the first time. The likely pacesetter will lead as far as she can for trainer Peter Eurton, whose last 15 sprint-to-route maidens on dirt produced 5 wins. 1-5-3

Race 2

Although 4 INNER BEAUTY is not likely for the same slow-pace scenario as her recent victory in a N3L claiming turf sprint, she gets the nod moving up in class to open \$25k claiming and cutting from six and one-half furlongs to five. The veteran may prefer a longer distance, and she faces other speed, but in her current sharp form the front-runner/pace-presser rates a slender edge. 8 TEEN DRAMA is a bona fide five-furlong specialist, 3-for-7 at this distance. She drops from starter allowance to claiming, the level at which she won twice in winter. The outside post does her no favors at this abbreviated five-furlong trip, however. The past six years, posts 6+ have been only half as productive (7.8 percent wins) as the inside five posts (14.6 percent). Thankfully, Santa Anita does not run five-furlong turf races often. 4-8-5

Race 3

This maiden-20 sprint is a split of race 4; comeback drills by 3 ALOHA CHROME suggest he is ready to fire in his first start since a last-place debut in January 2023. He outworked company from the gate April 27 and can fire his best shot first start back. 4 INSTINCT D' ORO chased and faded in his debut against tougher maiden-50 company. Maidens trained by Hector Palma typically improve second out; the colt benefits by a class drop. 3-4-8

Race 4 4-5-6

4 WESTERN POWER drops to the bottom after he chased and faded in a fast maiden-50 that race-3 contender Instinct D' Oro drops from. This race is easier, even though 'POWER faces a pesky pace rival two stalls to his outside.

Race 5 8-9-1

First time at the bottom level for turf runners (\$25k claiming N2L), DR. SOULFIRE can rally for the win. The late-runner finished close enough to better company in recent starts; his speed figures rank among the highest in the field.

Race 6 6-7-3

This MSW filly-mare sprint is a good spot to take a shot with a filly who could slip through the cracks. 6 TAHINI set the pace and faded three recent starts, but those were turf routes. Her best races were dirt sprints, same as this. Back to one turn, back to dirt, she can score a minor "upset" with a forwardly placed trip. First-time starter 7 BOLT D'VINE looked sharp in her final work, five furlongs from the gate in :59.80. Although her dam has not produced a debut winner from four runners, older debut progeny of Bolt d'Oro have won at an average 13 percent, and trainer Phil D'Amato won with 2 of his last 3 MSW dirt-sprint firsters.

Race 7 2-1-4-5

Stakes-placed twice last year at age 3, 2 THE WILD GRAZER scored a good-looking comeback win over this downhill course, rallying from last of five to win going away. That N2X stamps the horse-for-course the one to beat in this filly-mare stakes. 'GRAZER is 2-for-3 on the hill, worked well since her comeback, and has plenty upside this season at age 4. One potential flaw is the allowance field she defeated last out was not great. Three of those ran back, all finished nowhere. 'GRAZER nonetheless is the top choice. 1 LUCKY GIRL ran better than the line looks finishing fourth in a G3 last out, her first start on the hill. A stakes-winning miler shortening to a sprint, she drifted out at the dirt crossing, lost focus, then re-rallied to miss by less than two lengths. Not bad considering her right-hand turn at the top of the stretch. If she gets covered up, and handles the crossing more professionally, she could score an off-the-pace upset. The top pair could be compromised by pace. This field is short on speed.

Race 8 9-4-7

BEST BET:9 MC VAY appears a standout in this maiden dirt mile, as he drops from a series of graded stakes including a troubled seventh last out in the Santa Anita Derby. The class of the field, MC VAY is drawn outside where he may lose ground but he will avoid the kickback that, for him, has been problematic. The fastest on figures, running long vs. maidens for the first time, this is the best chance yet for MC VAY in his sixth start. It could be the first time he is favored. 4 METRO is a \$2.5 million Quality Road second-time starter whose fourth-place sprint debut was only a prep.

Race 9 1-8-4-7

1 DE' MEDICI stretches out and faces winner following a highly rated (90 Beyer) maiden sprint win. This two-turn trip should be okay, DE' MEDICI ran well finishing second in a maiden dirt route two starts back, He figures for a two-hole trip behind likely pacesetter 8 VEGAS BURNER . The latter was claimed for \$50k from a blowout maiden sprint win, and will lead the field as far as he can. He is by American Pharoah, which gives him a right to stretch his speed.

Race 10 8-2-11-3

If she rations her speed while removing blinkers, 8 RUNAMILEINMYSHOES can handle this Cal-bred maiden turf mile. Her most recent start was her best yet; she set a strong pace, led to deep stretch, and got collared by a winner who rallied from far back. The third-place finisher also rallied from the back.

1st: 2-1/5 Dedos (2) gets the nod in the ole' lid-lifter at the "Downs After Dark" program this evening at the big oval in Louis-Town. This 2YO filly will face some colts in here, but that has never bothered this barn operator in the past. This one is bred and owned by the trainer, too, and that makes her even more dangerous. Working very well and the the sire hits with .31% of first time starters. Dam has 2 winners from 2 starters. Barn wins with .32% when debuting in the MCL ranks, as well.

2nd: 2-6-7-3 The first Key Play of the Day comes here, if you don't count my single play in the first. And, I go with another deuce in here with Green Light (2). This 3YO son of Hard Spun ran a huge 2nd in the last out at KEE. Could have won that one with a little better trip and not a 4-wide move at the top. Gets a rider who has earned a great reputation, but is winning with only .10% of the first 67 rides this meet. Hmmm. Still, the trainer wins with .31% when routing for the 2nd time, too. I'm all in

3rd: 1-6-3-2...Rock Star Doctor (1) won the last time out and it's never easy to go back-to-back. But this trainer wins with .33% when trying to repeat in the claiming ranks. Trainer has heated up after a terrible Turfway Park Meet. Has gone 5-1-0 in the last 14. Sharp work on May 11. Rider is winning at a .05% rate. Ugh. But I stick with the horse. I bet the 1 across the board and then box the 1-6 in the exactas. I will key the 1-6 over/under the 3-2-4-5 in two smaller units.

4th: 1-2-4-3 Another Key Play of the Day comes here with the rail bird — Disarm (1). This 4YO son of Gun Runner is destined for the breeding shed soon, but congrats to Winchell Thoroughbreds for keeping this one in training. Nearly won the G1 Travers at Saratoga to end the 2023 campaign. Before that, did win the G3 Matt Winn here and was a major 4th in the G1 KY Derby before that. Has won over \$1 million.

5th: 2-4-6-5...Fan the Fire (2) is another inside presence that I like early on the card this night. This 5YO gelded son of Hard Spun has raced here 3 previous times. Has a win and a third. Won last time out here, too, at the \$20,000 level. Bumps up in class and dollars, too, which is never easy to do. But the barn wins with .25% when trying to repeat in the claiming ranks. Does go from a route distance to a sprint, but this one has flashed speed going long. Will stalk and close at this distance.

6th: 5-6-(13)-7-9 Active Duty (5) is still looking to break the maiden after 12 starts. Does have 4 seconds and 2 more thirds on the resume, but must find a way to get in front at wire time. Drop in class should help and the new rider is a strong finisher. Let's see. Admiral Hall (6) is my Upset Special of the Day. This one is listed at 12-1 in the ML and should stay rather high on the odds board, what with the apprentice taking the reins on this first time starter. Works are great.

7th: 8-9-1-10 G3 Louisville Stakes...My next Key Play of the Day comes here with Bold Act (8), who will be another heavy, heavy favorite. This 4YO gelding ran a huge 3rd in the G2 Elkhorn Stakes after shipping in this Spring from Dubai. Winner of that race came right back to win again. New rider knows how to ride the sod, and this one is a G2 winner in the UAE and a G3 winner in the U.S. Will be closing and will need a good trip, but this one has plenty of experience over the soft going.

8th: 9-1-4-3 P Firecracker (9) drew outside in this field, but that should not hurt this closing type. Has run here 9 times with a modest 1-1-1 mark. But this one is dropping out of Stakes company into a mid-major claiming event. That should speed this one up the most. Young trainer is talented and ready to make a mark in KY. Look out for this one. Fifty Cent Dollars (1) is another from the same barn and this one will make the debut for the new connections. Returns as a beaten favorite, too, and this trainer wins with .22% of the last 9 to do that.

9th: 5-1-3-4 Huntress for Hire (5) has not been out since last September, but the barn does win with .14% of the last 84 to be away from the gate for 90+ days. Broke the MSW here last May. Looks to have talent, but needs to stay in training this time around. Marmalade Skye (1) has gone 1-2-2 in the first 6 starts and that spells consistency and talent, too. Should be right there on the lead from the get. Motown Dynamic (3) is a possibility, as well. Broke the MSW just two starts ago at Oaklawn Park. This one has speed galore and could be a threat if left alone on the front end.

10th: (16)-(15) -3 -10-4-8 This is scheduled to be a 1-mile event over the Churchill Downs' sod, but if it comes off and is moved to the main track, this race will set up nicely for Extra Anejo (16). This son of Into Mischief ran 4th in the G1 Haskell to end last season. But this one broke the MSW at first asking in October of 2022. Won that one by nearly 10 lengths. If the race is not moved off the sod, I am firmly convicted here, too. I will load up — rather significantly — and bet Gray's Fable (3). Veteran 9YO son of Gio Ponti has a right to improve in the 2nd start off the layoff (trainer wins with .18% of the last 151 to do that), and has gone 6-5-2 in the 31 turf races going on the stat sheet. Will come from behind. If he gets the trip? Look out.

11th: 1-8-5-3-6 The night's finale has a projected post time of 11:10 p.m. Ouch. That is going to hurt a few people. I go with Alicit Intention (10). This 3YO Mitole filly has started 3 times with 3 thirds on the books. Last time out at KEE, only lost by 1/2-length. Getting better. Getting closer. Mischievousness (8) has hit the board in half of her career 6 starts, to date. Trainer is excellent and this one returns as a beaten favorite. Can stalk. Can finish.



Race 3 7 PAPA RIZZO ran great when last seen returning off a layoff here and it came on this sod (78 Beyer). In the 2022 meet, he finished 2nd off the layoff and on this grass but at odds of 11-1. He has a dirt prep going into this race where he finished last and to that we say...great. What? It was on the dirt and helps today's price. This gelding has speed to help with this outside post and connections find a good spot.

Canterbury

Race 4 8 CALZONE got turf Beyers of 66 and 68 in two of his last three turf starts and they all came on this sod. His last two starts at Tampa are just better and he was off slowly in his most recent or that Beyer would have been better.

Race 5 5 WILD THOR is by a 16% debut sire. His dam went 18-3-2-3 and earned 72K. Three of five sibs won and two beat winners (76K and 46K). Lots and lots of works for this and all for a barn that is 24% with 1st start maidens. 4VICTORIOUS VANDA is by a 11% debut sire. His dam was un-raced. Of 6 sibs to race, 5 won and 4 beat winners with the best earning 213K. The leading barn calls the shots but we would like to have seen more than three listed works at least as of this writing. 10WILSON BAY broke 6th of 7 in his debut and was facing Oaklawn foes when sent off at almost 13-1. He draws fine and is a 4YO.

Race 7 6 DISTORTED PRO got nice figs at Oaklawn only two and three back before running into a very good race in his most recent that came back key when 2 of 5 returned to win with huge Beyers of 100 and 98. This colt was sent off at 6-1 versus those. Does anyone see a horse in this race that is capable of those? Or even close? Of course not. This colt has speed and gets in light with the apprentice up.

Race 8 3 MARTINI BLU is a claimer at Oaklawn but an allowance runner here. We like the cut back to a sprint for this. This guy is proven on this dirt.

Yonkers: Analysis (Post 7:00)

BEST BET - BRONX BARISTA (5th) SPOT PLAY - SKY BOX (8th)

Race 1 - (3) THE WILL TO PLAY takes a pretty big drop from the 3-5YO \$30,000 claimer to a \$15,000 claimer tonight. He races for trainer Izzy Estrada, a barn that's on fire everywhere on the East Coast right now, and gets post relief from his race last Thursday. (1) SWAGASAURUS REX has an inside post for the first time in several weeks and owns a win in this class back in mid-March. (2) LYONS JOHNNYJNR tired last time out at Pocono but was racing well at Yonkers prior to that, and I'll include.

Race 2 - (5) LADY BLUE JAY comes south from Western Fair in Ontario into a high-percentage barn and meets up with a pretty wide-open group in this event. I'll give her a shot. (2) GIBSON GIRL was third against NW1 company at Harrah's Philadelphia most recently and has added Lasix for her 3-year-old season. (6) DUCK INTO THE NITE starts from the outside but did win at this level last Saturday night. That should have given her some confidence.

Race 3 - (7) JAQEN H'GHAR was scratched out of a scheduled start at Pocono on 4-30, so he hasn't raced since a qualifier on April 20 at the Meadowlands. Nevertheless, I anticipate he'll be ready for trainer Ake Svanstedt, and he performed well in a limited campaign in 2023. (4) YOU GOT IT didn't have much success in the John Brennan Trotting Series but shows a second in a much tougher winners of six but not more than nine event at Yonkers back on the 27th of March. (2) ENERGYSOURCE hit the board a couple of times in this class back in March and returns from Pocono off a second in his last appearance over there.

Race 4 - (1) PRIVATE SCOTT invades from Freehold with back-to-back victories and hails from the same red-hot stable as my top selection back in the first race. (2) SMOKIN BY N drops out of the \$30,000 claimers and shows three wins in this class in March and April. (4) I'M J BEE N tallied at this level a couple weeks ago and trainer Travis Alexander continues to have an excellent meet.

Race 5 - (5) BRONX BARISTA made the New York Sire Stakes final last year at age 2 and comes over to Yonkers off a romping win in her 2024 debut at Pocono on May 7. (4) A FEW CHOICE WORDS was second in the NY Excelsior Series final and won a Grand Circuit event at the Delaware County (Ohio) Fair as a freshman. This is her first pari-mutuel appearance of the year, but she did qualify pretty well at Woodbine Mohawk Park. (3) RAGS TO RICHES has an inside draw for the first time in her lines and has been showing plenty of early speed out of town.

Race 6 - (1) SULLIVAN merits another chance this week as he moves inside to the pole position and was game last week despite having to do the first-over work in a sped-up third quarter. (2) MAJOR DESIRE is back in very sharp form now with two wins and a second in his last three outings. Add in another inside post, and he's definitely dangerous again. (3) PAT STANLEY N has been in the top three in five of his last six .

Race 7 - NW5000L5/12500CLM Pace

(2) EMINEM HANOVER has been closing out his miles well lately and gets significant post relief this week. Add in that he was Brent Holland's choice, and I'll put him on top. (1) CERULEAN HANOVER dominated bottom level foes at Harrah's Philadelphia last time out and ships north. I anticipate he'll be handled aggressively from the pole position. (6) LONG WEEKEND A hit the board in both of his starts down at Freehold since joining Doug Dilloian Jr.'s barn. Dilloian has been sending out several live horses lately.

Race 8 - NW3/25000LT / NW1/12500LT Trot

(8) SKY BOX starts from the eight-hole but made up a bunch of ground after making an early break last week. Hopefully he can avoid a miscue tonight and deliver a similar performance. (5) A MAJORSMACKIN comes over from the Meadowlands with a win and a second in his last three starts. He broke last time at Yonkers in a NW3 test but was 3-1 in that race. (2) NATIONAL LOVE AS closed steadily at a well-meant favorite in a NW1 event a week ago. He had a bit of a gap in his schedule coming into that tilt, so he could be sharper here.

Race 9 - NW5000L5/12500CLM Pace

(6) GINGRAS BEACH never got involved from the eight-hole last Saturday but moves in a couple slots on the gate tonight, takes a second crack at bottom level rivals and gets a driver switch to Matt Kakaley. (3) PEETIE has been facing tougher company at Yonkers since joining Ron Burke's barn. He finds the NW5000L5 class this time and gets a bit of post relief as well. (2) GRATIAN HANOVER closed with pace in a third-place result last Saturday and gets an inside draw here.

Race 10 - 20000CLM Pace

(3) LIBERTY N FREEDOM steps up from the \$15,000 claimers but has been racing well lately and goes for Alexander off a claim here. (1) SHANWAY N hasn't won yet in 2024 but has been hitting the board with some regularity as of late and starts from the pole. He was also Holland's choice of a couple horses in this event. (5) ALOTBETTOR N also moves to the \$20,000 level from the \$15,000 class but has been first or second in his last four attempts. He has new connections with trainer Matias Ruiz claiming him two weeks ago.

Race 11 - 15000CLM Pace

(2) MISSILE SEELSTER gets a post relief/class drop combo tonight and gets reunited with driver Jim Marohn Jr. He picked up checks against \$25,000 claimers two and three starts back. (5) WAIMAC ATTACK N took one try against \$20,000 claiming foes last Saturday and now drops back down to the \$15,000 level. He was second at Yonkers two back and gives Alexander another contender on the program. (6) MAJOR MAKOVER was third in a \$15,000 claimer at Yonkers when last seen locally on 4-24 and races from that red-hot Izzy Estrada barn.
