First Race 2. St. Addie 6. Material Girl 4. Gabby's Legacy

ST. ADDIE rated early, before chasing to no avail going seven on her debut 20 days ago; Authentic filly is bred to handle distance, and she appeared to be a filly in need of some experience in that first appearance. MATERIAL GIRL took her shot after a good trip in the career debut sprinting, before proving to be no match; failed to improve in her second start when finishing far back of the talented Bernieandtherose (has returned to win twice since, including the East View with a 74 Beyer); was taking advantage of a great setup when rallying for second in a rich stakes race last time; Lasix on for the return to the maiden ranks. GABBY'S LEGACY was green in the turf debut going long; came wide and passed some horses behind a wire-to-wire winner in her dirt debut, then bumped into a blowout winner last time

Second Race **5** Broadway Lights **3**. Honorable Becky **1** Central Casting

BROADWAY LIGHTS earned a 73 Beyer winning her dirt debut in a race that was rained off the grass, then ran well in each of her next two starts, including another win with a 71 when turned back to sprint in her NY debut; Lasix on for the 3yo debut. HONORABLE BECKY came running from last to win her career debut in a short sprint at Finger Lakes; was outpaced by stakes horses in her second start, but once again finished gamely to hit the board; faded behind a blowout winner going a mile last time; cuts back.

Third Race 3. Break the Fall 2. Findaname 4. Allofasuddenlee

BREAK THE FALL made a useful run in the MSW debut early last year, then landed in a tough race for the level when trying this distance in his second start, after which he was laid up; showed speed in a race that fell apart late off the layoff, and was no match for that dominant, class-dropping winner last time; stretching back out for his third start off the layoff.

Fourth Race 2 Lumenique 4. Gallant Greta 7. Purpose

Though LUMENIQUE ran well on debut while putting in a late run and appearing to gain valuable experience; has caught wet/sealed tracks in two of her three starts since, including that first start back from a long layoff last time, for which Dutrow used the waiver; second off the break stretching back out.

Fifth Race **5** Iron Man Ira **3**. Six Kings **3** Tomacon

IRON MAN IRA ran well without winning in his first two starts on this circuit before things went off the rails a bit; posted an easy maiden win over this distance in his second start back from the freshening two starts back; drops after getting carried out early and then giving way against tougher last time. SIX KINGS showed surprising early speed when breaking his maiden with a competitive figure last September at Churchill; was claimed out of his next start and then laid up by Linda Rice, then lacked speed and was a non-factor on his NY debut last time; threat if sharper for the second start back.

Sixth Race 7. Prove Worthy 5. Cut the Cord 2. Strapped

PROVE WORTHY finished strongly to break his maiden going long with an 89 Beyer early on; he never really panned out after that, though he has managed to run well when getting some pace to come after; stretching all the way out, and he has been racing in good form since the claim. CUT THE CORD earned back-to-back Beyer tops in his two most recent starts; has run well without fail when out around two turns, though he has never been this far; dangerous second off the layoff.

Seventh Race 1. Al Ameeq 2. Silo Ridge 3. Light the Way

AL AMEEQ took a couple of starts to come around and then ran well in four straight races last summer in Kentucky while facing some tougher competition; has tactical speed and appears to be properly spotted making his NY debut off the trainer change to Ness. SILO RIDGE was only second-best in a race that came back fast in hos second career start two summers ago at Saratoga, then was able tp grind out a maiden win in his next start on this track; he did not appear to improve when stretched out for his two starts early last year, and wound up missing a lot of time; dropping sharply after failing to land a blow vs a much tougher field last time.

Eighth Race 6. Jerry's Out | Uncle Jim 8 Puckish

JERRY'S OUT got loose and scored an easy maiden win when dropped in class last October, then faced a difficult drop back in distance for his next start, where he was forced to chase and still finished gamely after having to alter out through the stretch; like him cutting back for this, and assuming all is well as he enters back without a break despite being vanned off after that last one. UNCLE JIM was game coming through on the rail before finishing that debut win off with a good run at Keeneland; he didn't run particularly well in his next start when in for purse only going a mile, then looked overmatched in the Withers last time; steps back and might be best sprinting.

Ninth Race 1. Ah Ca Ira ** Best Bet ** 2 Frankie Hiccups 7. Mary in the Irons

AH CA IRA lost position after being put in tight at the start two back going this distance, and actually did well to finish a distant third in that spot; was off to a better start last time but wound up contesting the pace with the favorite before opening a big lead around the turn, and she was tired when the rallying winner came for her late; deserves another chance, despite being listed as a vet scratch (illness) from a similar spot two weeks ago. FRANKIE HICCUPS had no chance with top juvenile NY-bred filly With the Angels on debut at Saratoga; ran well when back over fast dirt two starts later when settling for second in a live race - each of the first, third, and fourth finishers returned to win - but disappointed in that last one after bobbling at the start before chasing the pace.

THREE TIMES gets back on the grass, and though this filly was far back in her only try on this surface that was a route, and she had little chance to last in the lane after racing close to the pace in a race that set up well for the closers; new barn excels with turf sprinters and tis filly could offer relative value on the class rise. PRECISELY is the one to catch and beat and it won't be easy if she's able to run back to that last effort and Beyer; has speed and an inside post, and her early speed could provide a big edge if she can shake loose from the start.

Sixth Race 7. Feast 2. Grimes 4. Old Town Road

FEAST was shelved following the Scooter Davis claim back in December but he's a threat today if he can run back to that deceptively good effort, as he was rallying with interest while down inside after racing close-up in the early stages; barn scores at 27% off the claim and at 38% off this type of freshening. GRIMES has room to move way up at this reduced level, as he exits open \$10,000 claimers and now meets \$5,000 restricted claimers; Beyers fit well enough and he does have the tactical speed to stay close, which could prove an edge. OLD TOWN ROAD takes a short step up off the win against non-winners in six months; figures to be a little closer to the lead at this slightly longer distance and given the inside draw.

Seventh Race 3. Growth Capital Q. Coastal River 4. Lena's Jazz

Eighth Race 2 Miss Interpatation 3. Ran the Red 4 Miss Emily

MISS INTERPATATION failed to threaten in her debut but she was actually rallying with interest while not being pushed through the late stages, and she galloped out well enough to suggest she's better than she showed in that sprint; makes her first start off the claim for trainer Leslielyn Hardesty, who has scored with three of nine such runners going back to 2022.

Ninth Race 1. Rocio 5. Altamira Sur q. Dynamic Actress

ROCIO was behind a few of these same runners in her latest but she was moving well late after she may have been hampered by the race flow, as that was a race featuring a two-speed exacta; prior Beyer certainly stamps her as a contender in this nightcap, if she's able to run back to it.

Race 1:

sonadora GIRL has faced some tough claiming competition at Parx and Penn National, but now returns to the Gulfstream Park main track, where she has a win. I like this post with Paco Lopez aboard. MAMA MARIA gets a significant drop in class for the Jose D'Angelo barn and will cut back to the six-furlong distance. CLASSIC DIVA will return to the main track for the first time for trainer Ron Spatz and should appreciate the class relief, dropping from the \$17,500 claiming level to \$8,000.

Race 2:

MY BRAZILIAN GIRL will take the blinkers off after trying them last time out, where she was too keen on the front end. She should settle better now without them and has the ability to pass horses in what looks like a race with plenty of early speed. JUST SO PRETTY doesn't seem eager to pass horses, as she sat in a perfect spot last time but faded late. FLEETINGLY came from the clouds at Tampa in her U.S. debut. She's not a very big filly and will have to work out a trip from this outside post.

Race 3:

DID I DAZZLE YOU has strong figures on the Tapeta surface and will now return to the main track, where she is well drawn in this wide-open field. **SHILOH** finished second at this level last time out and could take a step forward here. **ONE SPECIAL ACT** finished

fourth going six furlongs and will now stretch out to seven furlongs, making her a contender to round out exotics.

Race 4:

MINXY has only raced on Tapeta twice, finishing second and third in those starts. Dropping to the \$8,000 level, she looks like the one to beat. JURASSIC CHICK got the job done at this level for non-winners of two and is well drawn to take the step up to the non-winners of three condition. SMART JENNY has been knocking at the door, and today could be her day.

Race 5:

WANT ALL THE SMOKE drops from the \$50,000 claiming level to \$35,000 in just her third start, and she continues to improve figure-wise with each race. **PRETTY LIZA** finished third at this level and retains Irad Ortiz, but the rail draw isn't ideal for a Tapeta sprint. **HAPPY SNAPPY** lost all chance at the break on debut when she tossed her head at the start and was very wide. If she breaks sharper today, she should be more forwardly placed.

Race 6:

A very wide-open turf event kicks off the late Pick Five. **BRENNA** drops in class after making her lone turf start against stakes competition. It's uncertain whether she truly prefers the grass, but in this field, she's worth a shot. **NEBLINA** has a win over this

course at this level, but she now stretches out to a mile and a sixteenth, which could be pushing her limits. **CAMMS PRINCESS** has run well on turf, though her lone victory came on Tapeta. She could still be a factor in this spot.

Race 7:

JACK'S PROMISE ran some strong figures at Churchill last year, and if you put a line through his two Gulfstream races, he could be in the perfect spot here—if he can recapture that form. LAWLER was a maiden taking on stakes competition last year and is a very game horse who could be a factor in this spot.

Race 8:

INSISTING has finished second and third in his last two starts at this level and looks primed to break through today. With tactical speed, he should be well-positioned throughout and gets a favorable setup against this field. ALPHA BLUE is a logical contender, given the strong Saffie Joseph/Irad Ortiz connection/, but he was beaten by INSISTING last time out and will need to turn the tables here. FRISSION is making his first start off the claim for Oscar Gonzalez, a move that produces a 22% strike rate, making him an interesting new face in the mix.

Race 9:

KING D, ORO was a dominant winner on the Tapeta track two starts back, drawing off by open lengths, and looks like the one to beat here. With two starts over the surface, he has a win and a second-place finish, making him a proven performer on this footing.

TALBINGO is undefeated in two career starts and made a seamless transition to the Tapeta last time out, delivering a convincing

victory. **HEYMACITSJACK** has only raced on the Tapeta once at Gulfstream Park, and that was quite some time ago, but his back class numbers suggest he fits well in this group—provided he handles the two-turn distance.

Race 10:

In this wide-open turf finale, which boasts a stakes-caliber field, URBAN LEGEND returns to the races as a gelding for the first time after an impressive turf victory at Keeneland. The physical change should be a positive, as he was always a big, heavy horse, but this far outside post could make trip dynamics tricky. XY SPEED is as game as they come, with 14 wins from 42 career starts, and comes off a runner-up finish at this level. His consistency and determination make him a strong contender. MATTINGLY made a strong return from a layoff stretching from August to February, overcoming some race trouble to finish third. If he can work out a clean trip, he could be a major player here.

First Race **1** Lear **3**. Royal Court

6. Yourcuznfromboston

LEAR gets the nod in the opener for his consistent nature and competitive Beyer Speed Figures. ROYAL COURT put in a big run to win at this distance last out at Oaklawn. YOURCUZNFROMBOSTON could steal away on the move from five-eighths to a mile and a sixteenth.

Second Race 14. Texas Sequoia 7. Tactical Express 2. Moenchanted

TEXAS SEQUOIA is on the also-eligible list, but would be a chief contender were she to draw into the body of the race as she was second against similar last out at Oaklawn. TACTICAL EXPRESS faced steeper last time, while MOENCHANTED is a fresh horse with speed and she draws a post that might give Arrieta options.

Third Race **8**. Bertie's Cause **6**. Trafalgar Shore **7**. Ship It

BERTIE'S CAUSE returns to the claiming ranks, site of her last win. TRAFALGAR SHORE ran a fine second off the bench last out at Oaklawn. SHIP IT has run some races that would land her in the winner's circle in this spot.

Fourth Race 13 Lions Not Sheep 14. Cajun Eddie 3. Lucky Boss 7 MO MOVES

LIONS NOT SHEEP is on the also-eligible list, but is appealing for his runner-up finish for this price last out at Oaklawn. He's also a five-time winner facing some less-experienced rivals. The also-eligible CAJUN EDDIE is a six-time winner. LUCKY BOSS is back at a mile and a sixteenth and he's a winner at the distance. Another of interest is COST BASIS.

Fifth Race **5** Complex Secret **8**. Daisy Duke **9**. Baytown Butterfly

COMPLEX SECRET and DAISY DUKE are logical choices back after running well in a quick sprint last out at Oaklawn. The start was the first since October for DAISY DUKE. BAYTOWN BUTTERFLY is appealing from a class standpoint as she has seen steeper.

Sixth Race 4. Express Cruiser 5. Boat Song 8. Moon Over Egbert EXPRESS CRUISER was just edged last out in his first start since November. He owns the field's best last-race Beyer Speed Figure. BOAT SONG exits a quick race against steeper. MOON OVER EGBERT is back at one turn and he's a multiple winner at the configuration.

Seventh Race 11. Lemon Muffin 2. Best Seller 2. Malibu Smart LEMON MUFFIN is a Grade 3 winner at this distance at Oaklawn. BEST SELLER is back on dirt, site of her last two wins on form. MALIBU SMART could be sitting on a peak race in her third start since last March.

Eighth Race 3. Cane Creek Road 6. Trikitraki 10. Raven's Nest CANE CREEK ROAD has been facing higher-priced foes in Southern California. TRIKITRAKI is back on dirt, site of his best career Beyer Speed Figure. RAVEN'S NEST was a winner the last time he raced for a tag.

Ninth Race **1**. Speed Bias **4**. Magic Tap **6**. Masqueparade SPEED BIAS has recency on probable favorite MAGIC TAP as the latter is making his first start since last season's Oaklawn Handicap, which has produced a pair of next-out stakes winners. Both of these runners are Grade 3-placed and proven at this mile and an eighth distance. MASQUEPARADE is the most accomplished member of the field as a Grade 3 winner who has earned more than \$900K. Tenth Race **6** Honduras Passion **1** Range Life **4**. Very Cosmopolitan HONDURAS PASSION is back in the statebred ranks following a credible effort against open foes. RANGE LIFE has the speed to hold her position from the rail. VERY COSMOPOLITAN owns competitive Beyer Figures.

BEST BET: Muscled (9th race)

First Race 2. Jai Ho 4. Matina 6. Tianma

Runner-up in a similar N2L claiming turf sprint last out, JAI HO merits horse-to-beat status cutting back to six furlongs on her favorite turf course. The best three races JAI HO ran were three turf sprints at Santa Anita. She has a pressing style to create her own forwardly placed trip, her speed figures in SA turf sprints exceed par for this level. MATINA drops in class from a fourth-place finish in a relatively fast starter allowance on dirt. The challenge is to reproduce form moving back to turf. Her first two starts on turf were not good (eighth, ninth), but she is a better filly since those races a year ago.

Second Race 4. Discrepancy 2. Trouble N Paradise 2. Chollima

DISCREPANCY benefitted from a cut-the-corner trip last out to defeat four of her six rivals in this \$8k claiming sprint. It was fourth win by DISCREPANCY from her last six starts; she runs back at virtually the same level (slight drop from \$10k claiming to \$8k) and is the "now" filly. TROUBLE N PARADISE is worth a longshot look returning to California after a 1-for-4 winter campaign in Arizona.

Third Race 3. El: Rey Rey 2 Presider 6. Baldoro

EL REY REY can upset likely favorite PRESIDER in this N3L starter at a mile and one-eighth on turf. 'REY REY was claimed from a N2L win over this course and distance; his typical off-the-pace style matches the closers-friendly profile for this distance. Nine of the 13 races this winter at a mile and one-eighth on turf were won from the back half of the field; none were won by the pacesetter. 'REY REY was claimed last out by Hector Palma, whose five-year f.o.c. win rate is 28 percent (9 for 32). PRESIDER is likely to start favored based on his last-out runner-up finish racing a mile on turf at this level. Furthermore, PRESIDER could be loose on the lead. That scenario probably compensates for the pro-closers course profile. BALDORO meets tougher after he was claimed from a runner-up finish at one mile, a turf race in which he did not have the smoothest of trips. He won a N2L claiming race at this longer turf distance two back.

Fourth Race 1. Liquid Spirit 7. Gracie's Big Day 6. Nostri Vires

LIQUID SPIRIT returns to the claiming ranks and returns to dirt following an okay third in a starter allowance on turf. Her best races are on dirt including a runner-up finish here two starts back. She adds blinkers, and meets a field without much true speed.

Fifth Race 3. I'm a Bad Boy 5. Drop Um 6. No Poking Around

I'M A BAD BOY drops from a \$175k Cal-bred stakes in which he was eased, to Calbred allowance. He also returns to turf, switches riders, and adds Lasix. Based on his runner-up finish two starts back in a route stake at LRC, and close third in a turf sprint three back, he might handle this turf mile. Edwin Maldonado takes over. DROP UM ran better than the top choice last out in the same race.

ALL TURF PICK-3 : 3.5/5/1.10

Sixth Race **8**. Empress Lorrayne **9**. Hoser Satrapa **3**. Captain Willis

This \$8k maiden-claiming sprint is restricted to horses/horsemen based in Northern California. The only filly in the field gets the call. EMPRESS LORRAYNE displayed ability finishing second in a pair of low-level maiden-claiming routes last year at Pleasanton; those efforts stamp her the one to beat adding Lasix and shortening to a sprint. HOSER SATRAPA is likely to improve off her okay third-place debut here 19 days ago. She was not quick early while outrun, angled out for the drive, and finished evenly. Not bad. She ran like a filly that can improve as she gains experience. CAPTAIN WILLIS figures for a piece off his runner-up finish last out in his first try over the track, and first with Lasix. That race earned the highest figure of his career.

Seventh Race 5. Molly Jensen 9. Lee's Baby Girl 8. Infinity Dream

Runner-up last out in a similar maiden-50 turf sprint, MOLLY JENSEN gets the call over also-eligible class dropper LEE'S BABY GIRL. The runner-up finish by MOLLY JENSEN was better than it looks. She was briefly stalled behind traffic on the turn, angled outside, and finished well. The winner Prime and Ready returned to win her next start. AE-lister LEE'S BABY GIRL would be wheeling back in a week and dropping from a third-place finish for maiden-80 at one mile. She has not sprinted since early last summer, but the speed she produces in route races suggests she will like this six-furlong trip. A 10-start maiden, 'GIRL finished in the money seven times, but lost as the favorite four times.

Eighth Race 3. Jubilant Joanie 5 Over Attracted 6. Lisa's Nonno

JUBILANT JOANIE is on a roll. The streaking mare has won three in a row, seven of her last eight. She consistently earns figures higher than her rivals, handles any surface, and can sprint or route. 'JOANIE can join her Jeff Mullins-trained stablemate Queen Maxima as the first three-time winners at this meet. OVER ATTRACTED merits a longshot look while stretching back to two turns and returning to dirt. She misfired last out in a hillside race on "good" turf, but her dirt sprints in December and January compare favorably to these. She has won running long.

Ninth Race | Muscled | 10. Rank | 8 Mythical Reel

Both recent runner-up finishes by MUSCLED were validated when the winners won stakes races their next start. MUSCLED stays with maidens in this turf mile, adds Lasix, and figures for a ground-saving trip from the inside post. Trainer Paddy Gallagher won with 6 of his last 8 favorites in maiden turf routes.
