# Pimlico: Preakness Day Saturday

RACE 1 No. 7 Exploration has found a home sprinting since cutting back in distance to start his 4-year-old campaign and winning two straight before receiving a freshening for this. PICKS: 7-5-3

RACE 2 Thinking that No. 9 Drop the Hammer will be favored here, will take a shot with No. 6 Miss Ellary, who ran out of gas last out in her first turf try in more than eight months. That was a solid front-running effort before running out of gas, but she can improve here third off the layoff. Drop the Hammer faced better last out as well as faced traffic and should improve in second start for potent Graham Motion barn. The horse to beat, but value better on Miss Ellary. PICKS: 6-9-3

RACE 3 Going to try to take down a couple of big names here with Racing Hall of Fame trainers Todd Pletcher and Bob Baffert both having Triple Crown-nominated colts entered, but it's No. 7 Drill Baby who I think can pull the upset trying two turns for the first time in his third career start. No. 3 Varney might be too quick for everyone early, but I'll take the bigger price on Drill Baby striking oil for us early in the card. \*BEST BET\*PICKS: 7-3-1

RACE 4 (Maryland Sprint Stakes) If I'm wrong about No. 6 Booth then I'll take a seat, but this Mitole colt for Racing Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen looks to be one of the most likely winners. The biggest concern is that he is giving 4-6 pounds to his six rivals, but any of his three consecutive stakes wins this year at Oaklawn win this. PICK: 6-2-3

RACE 5 The biggest question is what to do with No. 11 River Seine in her first start in America. I am inclined to want to see one given she tailed off from at the end of her season last year. Flavien Prat aboard intrigues but will only add to the underlay. No. 4 Lilly Simone will need some pace to close into, but I'm figuring on some improvement in her second start this season. No. 5 Parola Sicura has raced locally for hot trainer Joe Sharp, who lures Luis Saez aboard. PICKS: 4-5-7

RACE 6 (Skipat Stakes) Short prices in sprint stakes seems to be the theme of the day, as No. 7 Striker Has Dial just looks better than these, possessing advantages tactically and analytically. The one caveat is both wins this year were big steps forward from what we saw from her as a 3-year-old, but trainer Horacio De Paz has done a good job spreading her races. PICK: 7-5-3

RACE 7 (Gallorette Stakes) No. 3 Ocean Club ran well in her first start for Bethany Baumgardner, chasing a fast pace before getting shuffled back and coming on again. She should improve off that in second start for barn and John Velazquez aboard. No. 1 Dana's Beauty might get the right trip from the rail assuming our top pick sets the pace. No. 9 Way to be Marie always fires, but I don't love the outside post while picking up 6 pounds off the stakes win last out. No. 7 Three Havanas a wild card, but dropping into the claiming ranks at end of last year enough for me to want to watch one stateside.

PICKS: 3-1-9

RACE 8 (Chick Lang Stakes) No. 8 One Nine Hundred caught some tough draws in his first two career starts, finishing behind next-out winners in both including the ultra impressive Colloquial. Start 3 was an emphatic gate-to-wire performance that would win this if repeated. No. 7 Faster Gator might be undervalued here given the local connections, but that bullet workout ahead of his third start-off-the-layoff intrigues. PICKS: 8-7-1

RACE 9 (Jim McKay Turf Sprint) Not sure where that race from No. 8 Mattingly came from last time when finally living up to his sire Bucchero's legacy with a sharp turf sprint score, but if he can replicate that here then he's the winner. No. 4 Witty will come from way out of it, and that kept me from tabbing on top, but Prat's presence can't be undersold on a consistent horse who could move forward in second start of season. No. 5 Determined Kingdom a turf sprint specialist who likely needed that first start back. PICKS: 8-4-5

RACE 10 (Sir Barton Stakes) Stakes debut for the regally bred No. 6 Invictus, whose sire is Into Mischief — sire of three Kentucky Derby winners including Sovereignty — and whose dam is 2019 Kentucky Oaks winner Serengeti Empress. And, oh, yeah: He cost \$1.2 million as a yearling. That's a lot of expectations, and while the career debut did not go well, the return more than eight months later was a spectacular effort. Sky is the limit for this one. PICK: 6

RACE 11 (James W. Murphy Stakes) No. 5 End of Romance made his two-turn turf debut last out and hopefully learned something when fifth beaten just a length after a desperate finish. Velazquez hops back aboard here and wouldn't be surprised to see more zip early given the recent drills at trainer Motion's Fair Hill base. No. 7 Reagan's Wit deserves a mulligan after not showing much as the 9-5 favorite in the Transylvania, but we already know he is capable of better. PICKS: 5-7

RACE 12 (Dinner Party Stakes) I certainly don't love post 13 of 13 for No. 13 Trikari, but there is no question in my mind that he is among the best in this group, and if he moves forward off that Maker's Mark Mile in now his second start as a 4-year-old then he is the most likely winner. Interesting spot here for No. 9 Irish Aces, who has only gone this 1 1/8-mile trip once in his career, but I can't imagine trainer Brendan Walsh is just coming for the crab cakes. PICKS: 13-9-6

RACE 13 (Preakness Stakes) The win pool of this race will be very interesting given how inefficient that same pool was in the Kentucky Derby. I am referencing No. 2 Journalism being 3-1 in the win pool but closer to 2-1 in other pools. Sovereignty was the fourth choice in win wagering but second choice in the other pools. I bring this up because there is no sense trying to get cute with exactas, trifectas and such when a horse like Journalism — easily one of the top 3-year-olds in the country and the best/most accomplished horse on paper among this group — might be more than even money. I will bet him to win at odds of 6-5 or better. No. 3 American Promise should run better here than in the Derby. That seven-week layoff is an eternity for a D. Wayne Lukas trainee. No. 8 Clever Again is the "new shooter" with the heaviest artillery. PICKS: 2-3-8

RACE 14 (UAE President Cup) This is an Arabian race. Enjoy your Journalism winnings. Selections 6-9-2

# Seventh Race 1. Dana's Beauty

# 8. Sparkle Blue

2. Queen of the Mud

DANA'S BEAUTY will have the chance to be forwardly placed on the rail in this race, and if she runs back to her performances on turf last year, she could be extremely dangerous.

# Eighth Race 9. Perfect Force 3. Ancient World 8. One Nine Hundred

PERFECT FORCE made his last two starts at a mile and clearly didn't appreciate going that far, so Lukas is cutting him back to a distance that worked considerably better earlier this year; colt finally broke his maiden and came right back to win an allowance in two impressive performances at Oaklawn, and if he can build on those instead of his last two stakes tries, he could be a dangerous stalking type in this field.

# Ninth Race 6. Coppola 2. No Nay Hudson 4. Witty

COPPOLA appears to be the speed of the speed in this field and has repeatedly proven that he doesn't mind fighting for the early lead; he was no match in two Grade 2 tries in Kentucky, but his form was strong enough over the winter to win two ungraded stakes at Gulfstream; this field is much closer to the Florida races than the Kentucky ones and he figures as a primary threat.

# Tenth Race 6. Invictus 7. Hymn 1. Crudo

INVICTUS made his 3-year-old debut after a long break last month and vastly improved, earning a 90 Beyer in a solid stalking effort at Keeneland; Cox had him ready to go off the bench and he immediately rewarded the trainer with a highly encouraging maiden victory; Cox has a 37% recent strike rate with stretch outs

# Eleventh Race 7. Reagan's Wit 4. Barbadian Runner 5. End of Romance

REAGAN'S WIT just missed in an ungraded stakes at Tampa Bay Downs two back and stepped up again to finish fourth in the Grade 3 Transylvania and Keeneland in April; the colt was knocking on the door of his first stakes win in both starts after a dominant maiden victory at Fair Grounds in January; this will be his fifth different track in five starts for DeVaux.

# Twelfth Race 13. Trikari 10. Fort Washington 6. Balnikhov

TRIKARI made his 4-year-old debut in the Grade 1 Maker's Mark Mile and ran remarkably well to finish third fresh off his winter break; Motion took this colt on a very ambitious tour in 2024 and didn't waste much time testing the waters again this year; it's rare that a Grade 3 race can provide class relief to a runner, so he should be seen as a likely winner in his second start back.

# Thirteenth Race (Preakness) 2. Journalism 6. River Thames 1. Goal Oriented

JOURNALISM seems likely to set the record straight after a hard-fought runner-up finish in the Kentucky Derby; that race is all about navigating and he actually managed to find a half-decent trip, but he was simply outkicked in the stretch by a runner making a later move; in California, he never faced a stakes field with more than five horses, but this field is a lot more similar to those than it is to the Derby; if rain becomes a factor, he just proved it isn't an issue. RIVER THAMES ran just behind the Kentucky Derby winner at Gulfstream two back and came up short again in the Grade 1 Blue Grass at Keeneland last time out; his Beyers don't inspire much confidence against the top pick and a few new shooters in this field, but the fact of the matter is that his performances match up well against some of the best runners of the crop. GOAL ORIENTED wouldn't be as seriously regarded with another trainer beside him, but Baffert tends to know when his runners can handle this sort of step up in

# WIN CONTENDERS

CLEVER AGAIN (Steve Asmussen): Of all the horses in Preakness 150, this one has the most potential to surprise. Not surprise in the sense that he'll be a big upset price. But surprise in the manner in which he might deliver a victory. His upside is immense after visually impressive scores at Oaklawn in both starts this year. He comes in fresh, running the day after the Arkansas Derby, a 48-day break that could see him really geeked up on the front end. He's a \$500,000 son of 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah and could sizzle or fizzle on Saturday. His ceiling could be to win by daylight; his ceilar is that he stops in a race a furlong longer than he's ever tried and in his first major class test. His damside pedigree indicates he should handle more. His BRIS late pace figures indicate how fast the tempo goes Saturday likely will tell what he's got left in the tank. AMERICAN PROMISE likely will be the key to the trip in terms of how fast he has to go to make the front. He easily dispatched a credentialed runner in GAMING (Bob Baffert) in the Hot Springs Stakes, but that one would be a double-digit price in the Preakness. Jose Ortiz rides here and not aboard SANDMAN, but that's more to do with timing than anything. The SANDMAN camp was slow to commit to the Preakness and Ortiz had given his commitment to Clever Again. Ortiz rode both to victory in a whirlwind Oaklawn weekend back at the end of March.

GOAL ORIENTED (Bob Baffert): There's no doubt some blind leap of faith here with the least-experienced Preakness 150 starter. The 2-for-2 son of Not This Time handled his Derby Day undercard stretch-out and earned a stakes date, but it didn't necessarily have to come 2 weeks later in the Preakness. Stablemate RODRIGUEZ (Bob Baffert) did not sufficiently recover from the foot issue that reportedly kept him out of the Derby and subsequently the middle jewel as well. Enter this maternal grandson of 2005 Preakness and Belmont winner Afleet Alex. He broke patiently in his route stretch-out at Churchill, just naturally pulling himself to the front around the clubhouse turn and never looking back despite being on arguably the worst part of the track. This colt also was patient in stalking and pouncing in his Santa Anita sprint debut April 6. Whether on the lead or rallying, he's been truly finishing strong and that's what is most promising. He posted a 100 BRIS late pace figure in holding off stakes-tested HYPNUS (Kenny McPeek) at CD, while his 97 BRIS late pace figure in the sprint debut was outstanding as well. To finish as strong as he did while setting a solid pace at Churchill is what puts him so high on my pecking order for Saturday. What's more, as we talk about how nobody wants to run back on 2 weeks anymore, this colt was on the workout tab 8 days after the Derby Day card and drilled a half-mile in a fast 47-3/5 (fourth-fastest of 35). He'll handle an off track, handle having to stalk if Flavien Prat opts to do so as the race shakes out and we'll see simply if he handles the level of competition and distance with a light and late-arriving foundation. Baffert has won the Preakness 8 times, most recently with a new shooter in 2023 victor National Treasure. Baffert hasn't been Baffert on this trail, but there ain't exactly a slew of Grade 1 players listed previously on this rundown.

JOURNALISM (Michael McCarthy): He's been the top-rated horse in this class from the first week of January until the furlong marker of the Kentucky Derby. There, SOVEREIGNTY (Bill Mott) laid claim to the current crown when forging past and delivering the first 2-turn loss of Journalism's career. Perhaps they'll get a chance to continue their debate either in the Belmont Stakes or beyond, but it's this son of 2007 Preakness winner Curlin who shows up in Baltimore. And that's significant on many levels for both the race and the horse. The Preakness needed Journalism on a marquee that lacked the Derby winner for no other reason than his connections said it was more important to have a Travers horse in August. Journalism was back on the track just days after the Derby and returned to jogging and galloping while showing signs of recovery worthy of making him the trip to Baltimore. There's not enough on video or to the eyeball to know for sure how he'll respond in the stretch after 2 taxing races in 14 days as only racing stress will give us those answers. But from a handicapping standpoint, here's enough on paper, pedigree and continued prominence over this particular group of challengers to assume he's strictly the one to beat. Journalism's routine, triple-digit BRIS late pace figures made him a Derby standout to me, so it was shocking to see him not give more response when Sovereignty came to him. But he had never had a horse rally outside of him in a race and never felt a left-hand whip - it was just after the left-hander from Umberto Rispoli that he basically submitted to the threat. I would prefer him to get out mid-track while stalking the pace, and with a long run to the clubhouse turn and manageable field size, the 2-hole likely won't keep him buried inside. McCarthy didn't want him 8 lengths back in the Derby, but some start and early trouble left him there. Figure him to be 4-5 lengths back at Pimlico and if he finishes with what we saw at Los Al, Del Mar and Santa Anita, it will take a freakish front-running effort by someone to beat him.

#1 GOAL ORIENTED (6-1): Unbeaten Baffert pupil looked good in defeating allowance foes P. has been first or second in each of his six on the Derby undercard at Churchill Downs in career runs to date, led by a game second his second lifetime appearance and will take a big class rise in the second leg of the Triple Crown. Not This Time colt has won from on the lead, and also off of the pace, and the fine step forward while making his U. S. debut. prospect put in a swift half-mile morning drill in advance of this start, as well. Flavien Prat retains the ride.

#2 JOURNALISM (8-5): Santa Anita Derby (G1) star was a strong runner-up in Louisville most recently and is the clear one to beat for conditioner Mike McCarthy. The son of Curlin gets a tricky draw near the rail for his local debut, but he is all class and also has the versatility to work out a favorable trip with regular pilot Umberto Rispoli in the stirrups.

#3 AMERICAN PROMISE (15-1): Virginia Derby hero endured a tough trip in the Kentucky Derby (G1) off the layoff and will show big improvement on Saturday. The Justify chestnut will be put into the race early under Nik Juarez, and I consider the colt to be a major factor at a big price while always prominent on Saturday.

#4 HEART OF HONOR (12-1): Son of Honor A. in the UAE Derby (G2) last time out. Jamie Osborne trainee is proven at the distance, and he could factor against this crew with a Saffie Osborne will take the reins once again.

#5 PAY BILLY (20-1): Local hope is in a fine form cycle in advance of his stakes debut with #8 CLEVER AGAIN (5-1): Jose Ortiz opts to stick tallies in the Private Terms S. and Federico Tesio S. in his last pair of outings. Michael Gorham pupil seems like a good fit at the 1 3/16-mile voyage, but he will have to prove that he is capable of running at this level. Regular rider Raul Mena will have the son of Improbable stalking the pace from the start.

#6 RIVER THAMES (9-2): Pletcher pupil won his first two races prior to coming home second in the Fountain of Youth S. (G2) and third in the Bluegrass S. (G1) as of late. Bay son of Maclean's Music hasn't done much wrong leading up to his Pimlico debut, and he will get first run on the deep closing types turning for home, too. Irad will be in the silks.

#7 SANDMAN (4-1): Arkansas Derby (G1) victor didn't have a smooth voyage in Kentucky last time out and will hope for clear sailing from off the pace against this group. Mark Casse-trained son of Tapit will receive a strong pace to rally into and will be doing his best work inside the final furlong with John Velazquez accepting the mount. Tapit colt could be the one.

with this budding star from the barn of Steve Asmussen. Bay son of American Pharoah is two-for-two this campaign led by a win in the Hot Springs S. at Oaklawn Park in his latest appearance, and the well-bred colt is surely moving in the right direction in advance of his first run in the graded stakes ranks. The Kentucky-bred will be in the mix from the opening bell at a fair price.

#9 GOSGER (20-1): Nyquist colt didn't topple a great field in the Lexington S. (G3) at Keeneland last time, but the improving prospect did it the right way for conditioner Brendan Walsh. The homebred has never run a bad one from three career outings to date, but he will have to get faster to overcome

**Race 1** #6 THAT'S FUNNY cuts back from two turns to one, takes the biggest drop in the game, and leaves the eye cups on the back side. Would only need to find one of those changes palatable to make an impression here, especially as she has done nothing but improve in all her one turn engagements. 4 CHOCOLATE CHOCOLATE is backed by solid DRF Formulator stat, as shedrow is a tight four for five with females at this level who hit the board 27-50 days in the rear, and are in receipt of the wonder drug. The winners came back \$13, \$8, \$9, and \$3.#5 LUMENIQUE was in the rear with the gear in the most recent, but that's no surprise, as this one hasn't hit the board in all four starts when breaking from posts 1-3. Chance to rebound. **6-4-5** 

**Race 2** #6 ERIC FROM MIAMI has set money ablaze in the last pair, but drops in class a bit, and is supported by a strong trainer statistic, which has this barn at a whopping 7 for 10 with mid level dirt stock off breaks of 19-60 days. The return on investment for that study is \$3.70+, and we'll give this boy another shot. #3 PROVISION was a gamely and decently clear runnerup in this race at 16-1 last out, and we see no reason to dismiss. #2 BECAUSE THE NIGHT has always been better on a fast track than one with moisture in it. **6-3-2** 

**Race 3** # 7 DEAR MOON showed nice improvement from her first start to the followup, Ran on well in her debut but start No. 2 saw a big move forward; not only ran 2nd, she finished far clear of the others; certainly looks headed the right way and she showed speed last time, too, which from this post translates to a nice stalking trip; 1 CLOUDY CHANCE was marooned in the curtain raising right here at the end of March, but gave a solid account of herself when completing the triple @ 21-1. Papa Engelhardt is on a surreal 7:6-0-1 run with locally based dirt stock who hit the board 47-56 days back. The winners for that study came back \$7 x 3, \$12, \$15, and \$11. **7-1-3** 

**Race 4** #2 ARTEMIS SOUND has gone 63-72-83 in her three sand starts to date, so right off the bat, who knows where her ceiling is in that regards. Gal was a going away victress in her last pair, and both of them came right here with one of them at today's tricky distance, while being first to load. From a Formulator pov, the Toddster is a whopping 17 for 34 with dirt dashers who got the job done 28-45 days in the rear, that are 5-1 or beneath. Lots of things to like here. **2-1a-8** 

Race 5 #1 ARGENTIERA may not have appear to have shown much in either sod start to date, but if you adjust those numbers a bit, they stand out quite favorably against most signed on. Bay gal slides in 10 slots for today's second try off the brake, and sheds a handful of pounds as well. Bond has the Golden Gun when it comes to his turf dashers off breaks of less than 48 days, as he is two for five with that type, while owning a subcategory of one for one at this level. 1-9-6 OFF TURF: 3-10-4-2

Race 6 #1 MAKES SENSE was a hard trying runnerup finisher versus similar sort down in Hallandale Beach 7 weeks in the past, and has fired off a couple of bullet breezes since, one of them coming up at Oklahoma, which is pretty impressive for a maiden, as that track plays very slow this time of year. Slight edge. #7 TIME PASSES has been beset by back-to-back layoff lines, but has recently received the unkindest cut of all, and could perk up a bit in today's second time on the dirt. #8 HOP SING ( "You named names!" ) has completed the exact in three or four career outings, while posting Beyers in the 80's in each of those. Completely logical.

Race 7 #2 PONANT nearly went all the way in his loan turf engagement down in Florida back in January, and the fellow who finished directly in front of him that afternoon got the job done when next in action, improving in the speed figure area by approximately 5.3%. Would not be surprised to see this boy try to go all the way once again beneath Javy, has done nice work for this outfit. 2-10-5 OFF TURF: 5-1-7-1a

Race 8 #3 ESCONDIDO owns a win and a third from three turf starts to date, while slowly increasing his figures over that stretch. The aforementioned tally was the only time he was made available for purchase, while also being his only start at today's distance of ground. Timid margin. #8 MR FLOWERS has received a trainer upgrade since last in action back in October, but owns a solid turf resume', and must be incorporated. #9 MODICA has partaken in the superfecta in five of his last starts on the poly or turf, but despite that, we feel he is going to be overlooked parimutually. Could jazz things up beneath. Off the turf 5-11(MTO)-1-12

Race 9 #4 CRIMSON LIGHT had a visually impressive win when starting things out last January, which was spoken about ad nauseam on social media. But something went amiss that day, or shortly thereafter, as he didn't face the starter again for 15 months. That being said, he came back victorious, and is now backed by a strong trainer stat. Over the last 60 months, T.P. rolls right along with his locally based dirt sprinters at this level who got the job done 36-50 days in the rear, and are beneath the 6-1 watermark. He's six of nine with that type, and has an R.O.I. of more than three and a half bucks. #3 LOTSA TROUBLE (uncoupled entrymate with the above) hasn't faced the starter since the first of March, but is 3 fer 7 beneath the seagulls, and that's enough reason to include. #2 WHITTINGTON PARK has done his best work right here, and may plod along for a piece.

Race 10 #4 CARA'S DREAMWEAVER comes in today off of career best number, and if you prorate that her sole turf routing try, then when you come up with is an adjusted 63.3, which came without using the wonder drug, or blinkers - - both of which that are now a part of the makeup. We're betting this one gets overlooked here, and we'll take a swing in a wide open event. #5 RED BURGUNDY hasn't faced the starter since Christmas time, but flashed a lot of speed the only time she came back off on absence, and although she faded late that day, it was versus steeper competition & without the "Big L.". 4-5-8 OFF TURF: 1-9-10-11

Race 11 #7 GATTATIZ has been MIA since late October, but is made available for purchase for the first time right here, while getting Lasix as well. Given the way that she improved from her first turf start to the next, we can see an avenue for a strong effort here. #8 PRINCESS SUMMER will likely take some pounding at the windows off of the dropdown, but it would behoove you to take a gander in he paddock given the long absence. #3 GOOD MISSION has only been out of the superfecta one time in her nine race career, and has to be left in the hopper. OFF TURF: 1-3-13-5

5<sup>th</sup> 8 AURORALINNA is kin to only one other starter but Love My Jimmy was a stakes-winning sprinter who won 13 of 38 starts and earned over \$284K; this filly has been training steadily toward her debut for trainer Dimitrios Synnefias, who has won with five of 17 firsters at Penn National, Pimlico and Monmouth over the past five years.

9<sup>th</sup> 4KNOX is a major upgrade candidate off his recent form, having raced off the pace in races where the speeds held the edge in three of his last four starts (note the bold "S" symbols in DRF running lines); that shouldn't be an issue today, as there does seem to be enough pace in this race to ensure an honest tempo up front, and he could be in line for a much improved effort in this nightcap.





INNOVATIVE has improved each successive start, she finished well and missed by only a nose last out racing one mile. She did benefit from a rail-skimming trip, but she ran her final quarter-mile in 24 seconds and acts like another furlong will benefit. She gets an eight-pound weight break (118 to 126) over her main rival NAFISA. The latter finished more than two lengths behind as the even-money favorite in the same race, but NAFISA actually ran okay. She put away the pacesetter, got challenged immediately, tried to fight back, and tuckered out in deep stretch. The pace of this longer race could be easier, NAFISA takes off blinkers but will be positioned in front of her main rival turning for home. ~CHURCH LADY^ raced evenly to split the field in the same race. It was the U.S. debut for CHURCH LADY, who is likely to improve second start back, second start stateside. Third-time starter TIME TO SHINE has an even-paced style racing one mile that suggests she wants this longer mile and one-eighth distance.

Close call between the top pair. ~CASCABEL^ wired maidens two weeks ago at Turf Paradise, and could influence the pace scenario.

Trouble-prone ~FREE AND HUMBLE^ had another bad trip one week ago, fifth as the favorite in a similar N3L claiming turf race while once again blocked badly in the lane. She is overdue for a clean trip.

'SILENCE will be rolling from behind. ~FINCAIRN^ finished off the board all 12 starts, but he has never faced a field quite this weak. This is his first time racing at the bottom level at SA.

He finished in the money three of his four previous sprints, and will be rolling from behind. He is trained by Mike Puype, who also entered comebackers ~HIGHPLAINSDRIFTER^. Also-eligible CURLIN COMMAND finished second both recent starts, but is marooned on the far outside; BONNEVILLE JIM can improve off his respectable fourthplace debut.

He showed in his third-place career debut three back that he also can run on dirt. There is plenty of pace here to set up his rally. ~KERRY GOLD^ has a pressing style that matches the speed-friendly track profile for a mile on dirt. Since the sprint meet began last month, 14 of the 16 dirt miles (through Sunday) were won by horses positioned 1-2-3. WINDRIBBON stretches out with decent sprint figures and speed for an up-front trip.

She worked well since; D'Amato has long contemplated a switch to the hill for the veteran mare who has been facing better company since her most recent win last spring. The drop into a non-graded stakes is another positive factor. UNCORKED must hold off late-running stablemate GRANNY BUDGIE, who returned from a six-month layoff with an impressive N2X win on the main turf oval. The 5-for-10 mare filly ran well on the hill last fall, she enters the spring season in peak form. She definitely can sprint; the question is if she is good enough to handle the hike in class. Comebacker ~LUNAR IMPACT^ ran well on the hill last year, her up-front style is an advantage in a race that could unfold at a tepid clip. VENGANZA also is proven on the hill: two allowance wins, third in a G3. She ran okay last out finishing fourth in a G3 turf mike; it seems sprinting is her best gig. ANG N ASH looms the upsetter; she finished only a neck behind VENGANZA last out and is another who likes the hill.
